During the meeting, following issues were discussed, leading to actions being taken by the concerned departments:

1.	Members expressed concerns about the lack of coordination between the pharmacy and the store. They highlighted issues where certain medicines were available in the store but not at the pharmacy, leading to availability discrepancies.	resolve the issue. A dedicated store for the pharmacy is currently in progress, and the
3.	Members recommended providing bedside X-ray services for all IPD patients.	As updated by Dr. Zafar,HOD, Radiology, bedside X-rays are typically preferred only for critical or immobile patients. They involve higher radiation exposure, give suboptimal image quality, and may not be suitable for certain cases due to posture limitations. In case of other patients, the Radiology department promptly attends to IPD patients referred for imaging, prioritizing them, to

		ensure they do not have to wait
		in line.
4.	Members noted that while some departments have an adequate number of data operators, others are understaffed, which causes administrative challenges.	We have repeatedly highlighted the shortage of data operators to the headquarters and are awaiting a resolution through the approval of additional staff.
5.	Members highlighted that the toilets near the ICU are non-functional, requiring attendants to use facilities on other floors.	Work is in progress and is expected to be fully repaired by 31 January, 2025
6.	Members noted that the list of patients with the security guard outside the ICU only includes bed numbers, requiring visitors to inquire by bed number. They suggested that a comprehensive list with both patient names and bed numbers would be a more efficient way to handle this.	The unit in-charges of the ICU, CCU, NICU, and PICU have taken note of the concern. Additionally, the DD General has been asked to explore the feasibility of installing a patient information system to address this issue.
7.	Members appreciated the effective management of the long waiting queues at the pharmacy, which has resolved the issue. However, they noted that patients often feel frustrated and harassed due to server downtimes.	The Dean informed the members that we are in the process of transitioning to more efficient systems. This issue is common across all ESIC hospitals nationwide and is expected to be resolved with the ongoing upgrades, as communicated by the headquarters.
8.	Members expressed concerns that, at times, IPD patients are required to visit the department in person for	there is a policy of providing
